Tuesday, The Service Dog Who Saved an Iraq Vet, Is Back On The Job In Burlington



America's most famous service dog begins a new chapter in a poignant story of hope and healing. "The thing you need to know about Tuesday is that he always wants to work, to be of service. It's what he knows, what he was educated to be: a service dog of the finest caliber. But, when you see Tuesday on the job, you recognize immediately that he is pleased with himself, too. And this brings joy to everyone, "Lu Picard said recently. Picard and her husband, Dale Picard , are co - founders of Educated Canines Assisting with Disabilities (ECAD), the not - for - profit organization that paired Tuesday, first with Captain Luis Carlos Montalván , a veteran of Iraq , in 2008 , and in 2018 , with Gordon Shafer of Burlington Connecticut , a senior with multiple disabilities . Tuesday's relationship with Montalván is the stuff of legend.

In 2014, I interviewed Luis Carlos Montalván, a retired Army captain. Montalván was a two - time Bronze Star winner who survived stab wounds, a traumatic brain injury, and three broken vertebrae during two tours in Iraq. He returned to his native New York City suffering from severe post - traumatic stress disorder. The subject of the interview was Montalván's service dog, Tuesday, a Golden Retriever who had recently won an AKC Humane Fund Award for Canine Excellence. Through personal appearances and a series of bestselling books, Montalván and Tuesday became America's leading advocates for pairing disabled veterans with service dogs. "Tuesday came in to my life at its darkest hour" Montalván told me. "My mind, body, and spirit were broken. It's been such an amazing change between 'before Tuesday and now, it's almost a duty to tell people about it. " The result of our interview was the AKC FAMILY DOG story "It's Always Tuesday." During our long conversation I got the feeling that the articulate, soft - spoken veteran had, with Tuesday's help, finally conquered the despair that had plagued him since his discharge. And so it was a shock to learn in December 2016 that Montalván had been found in an El Paso, Texas, hotel room, dead of a barbiturate overdose. He was 43. Here, Patricia Robert continues the story of the

remarkable service dog the captain left behind. —Bud Boccone Luis Carlos Montalván and Tuesday during the ACE presentation ceremony at the 2013 AKC National Championship By Patricia Robert ends, and indeed, has been made immortal due to the four bestselling books Montalván wrote before his tragic death in 2016. In his first book , Until Tuesday : A Story of a Wounded Warrior and the Golden Retriever Who Saved Him, Montalván wrote of his life , both before he had Tuesday, and then after, when they were a team . Before Tuesday, due the pain he suffered from physical injuries to his back and legs and, especially his crippling PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome), Montalván was unable to leave his New York City apartment except to go to the Veterans Administration. With Service Dog Tuesday by his side 2 4 / 7 , mitigating the effects of both the physical and emotional disabilities , Montalván completed his degree in journalism at Columbia University, wrote his books , and became a tire-less advocate for Veterans and the placement t of service dogs . He and Tuesday were constantly on the go, meeting people in government, making appearances on television, including Late Night with David Letterman and at book stores and hospitals. Never stopping. Tuesday won the AKC Humane Fund Award for Canine Excellence for 2013 – 2014.

In 2016, Montalván had his leg amputated. This changed everything, but Montalván hid his despair well. Before leaving for his fateful trip to El Paso, Montalván left Tuesday with a friend who lived near the ECAD campus in Connecticut. On December 2, 2016, Montalván lost his valiant battle with PTSD and the excruciating physical pain that had worsened in recent years. Tuesday came back to live with the Picards and was retired as a service dog. Until Tuesday, Montalván's moving account of his physical and emotional struggles, was a New York Times top - 20 bestseller. Young Tuesday was a natural for service work. "He always wants to work, to be of service." An ECAD canine, used to crowds, always meeting and greeting new people in new places, ECAD put him to work as a therapy dog. They arranged "Tuesday with Tuesday" events at libraries, hospitals, and schools. These events were noted on Facebook, much to the delight of Tuesday's many fans around the country. But, from day one, Tuesday's destiny was to be a service dog. Gordon Shafer and Service Dog Tuesday have been partners since February 2018. They completed ECAD's demanding a two - week Team Training Session in April of that year. The 64 - year old Shafer has Syringomyelia, a progressive degenerative disorder of the spine that cause great pain. He also has stage - 3 lung cancer. Both restrict his movement and could lead to his becoming sedentary. The effects of both conditions lead to a high level of anxiety. But being sedentary isn't Gordon Shafer, and Tuesday knows just how to make the walking easier and reduce the anxiety. Together, these two senior citizens, make each day count. Shafer and his wife, Lindy, had been ECAD Home Handlers for a year or so when Gordon Shafer thought that, just maybe, he should get his own Service Dog. As a Home Handler he had learned the commands that are part of ECAD's training process. On his visits to ECAD, he saw how the Service Dogs in Training were becoming adept at doing the tasks that would assist a person with physical disabilities. "I talked with Lu about filling out an application, but she was up front and said the earliest they would have a Service Dog for me, with the waiting list and all, was sometime in late 2019. When I thought of my own longevity, I was afraid that would be too late," Shafer recalls. "And, quite frankly, I didn't think it would be fair to a young dog, knowing that my time could be so limited." But then Lu Picard, as is so often the case, thought of a solution. "I have an idea—let me talk to Dale," she told Shafer. Dale Picard was 100 percent on board. The solution was Tuesday. And Tuesday didn't waste time in letting Shafer know just how he felt about the situation. "Somehow, from that first moment," Shafer says, "he knew that I was his new person. "The minute I got home and took off his leash, he stood by my side, looked at me, and then followed me right upstairs to my office. No running around to investigate the house. I sat down at my desk and he put his head on my knee, then got comfortable under the desk, with his head on my toes," Shafer says. "We are always in physical contact—at night he lies on his mattress next to my side of the bed, and I fall asleep with my hand on Tuesday. "Somehow, from that first moment, he knew that I was his new person," Shafer says. DOING GOD'S WORK Tuesday, or course, remains the very social dog he had become when travelling with Montalván. This has helped Shafer in unexpected ways. "He enjoys working and this encourages me to go out. So, no matter how I feel, I take him someplace at least once a day. We get in the car, go to a store and walk around. He enjoys that part of his

job," Shafer says. "We often stop by ECAD's Canine Education and Wellness Center in Winchester so he can visit with his friends. "But the main thing Tuesday does for me is to help me with the high anxiety I can have because of my lung issues. He realizes an attack is coming, even before I do. He will get up, nudge me with his head and stare at me until I look into his eyes. This makes me focus and keeps me from getting overly anxious," Shafer says emphatically. There is no question that Tuesday and Luis Carlos Montalván made an impact on the world. And now, with Gordon Shafer, Tuesday sees to it that his second person is still taking steps, going out, enjoying life, still having an impact on all they meet along the way. "We were blessed with Tuesday helping Luis to have a productive life for 8 years. And now he is caring for Gordon on his final path to peace," Dale Picard says. "To watch Tuesday at work is like watching God at work."—P.R. Also hearts must be evaluated by an approved veterinary cardiologist.
